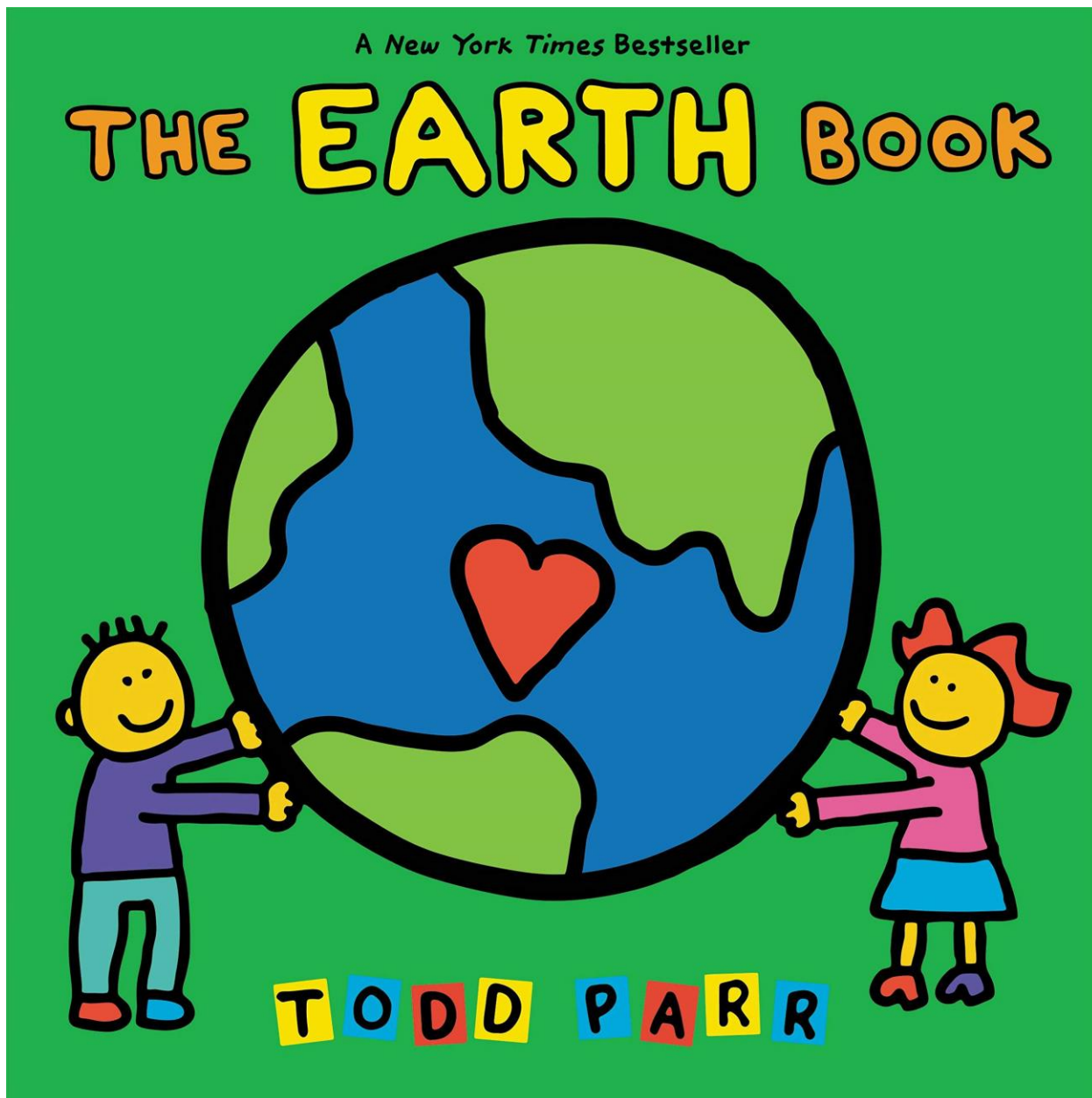

# Art Project:

## Earth Decorations

### What you need for this activity:

- \*Earth Outline (option 1)
- \*Green and blue materials
- \*Non-toxic Glue
- \*Chalk (Option 2)

### Directions:

#### **\*Option 1:**

To begin, print off the outline of the earth below.

\*Set out a bunch of different green and blue art materials for your child(ren) to choose from.

\*Then, ask your child(ren) to glue on green materials on the “land portion” and blue materials onto the “sea portion.”

#### **Option 2:**

\*Make a LARGE circle using the sidewalk chalk.

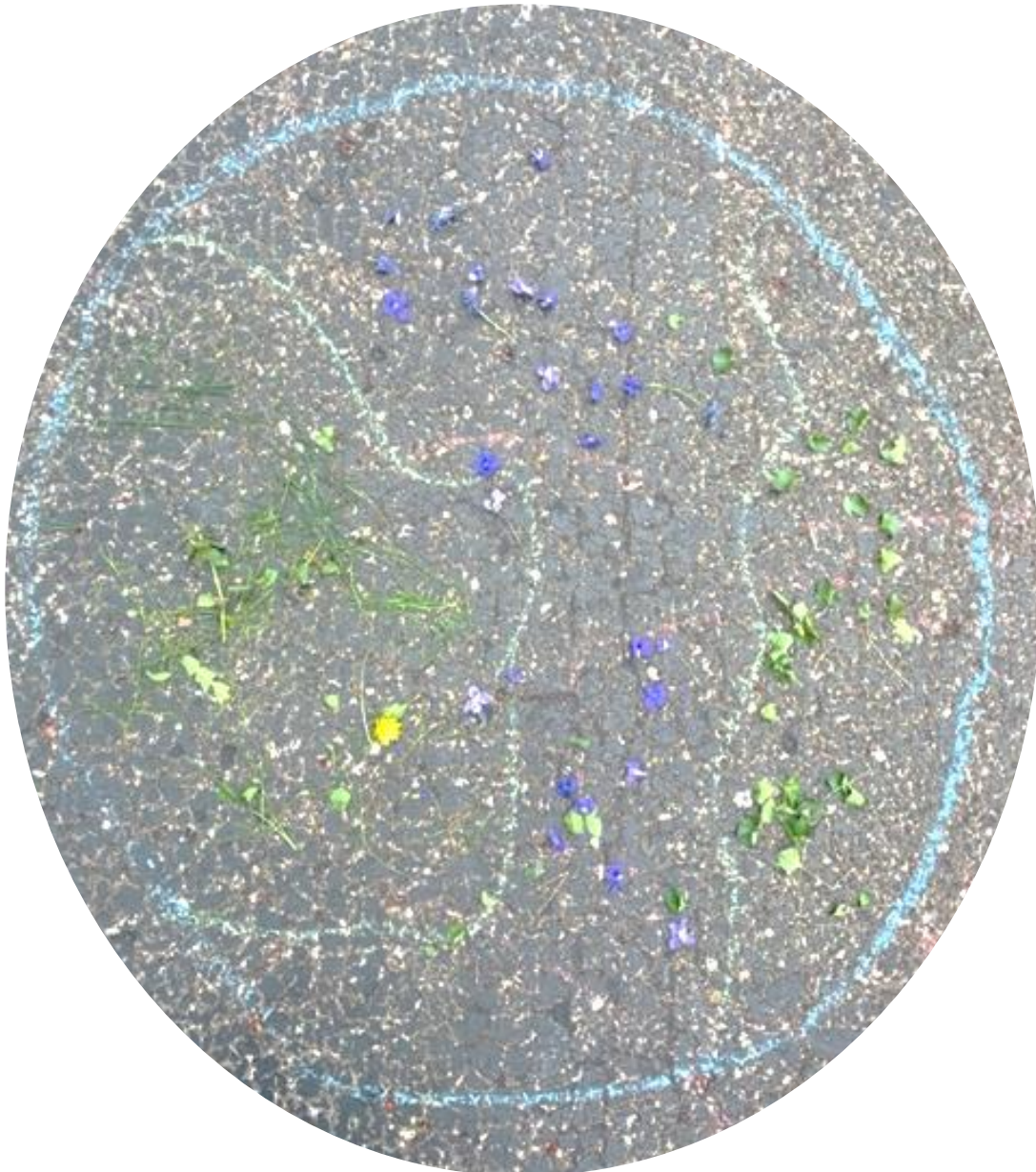
\*You may choose to draw the outline of where the “land” is or let children decide.

\*Ask your child(ren) to gather materials that are green (to represent the land) and blue (to represent the water). If they can find *natural* materials that are these two colors – even better! Though it is of course difficult to find naturally occurring blue items.

**Green ideas:** grass and leaves

**Blue ideas:** flower petals, blue berries, stones

\*Have children place the green items on the “land” and the blue on the sea! This will create a beautiful earth!





# Fine Motor Activity:

## Paper ripping

### What you need for this activity:

- \*Construction paper (can be scraps!)
- \*Recycle image
- \*Non-toxic glue

### Directions:

- \*For this activity, your child will practice ripping paper, the act of doing this helps build fine motor muscles!
- \*Ask your child to rip up paper into small pieces and place on the recycle symbol. Then have them glue it on! Please note-the pieces should be small enough to fit inside of the symbol so you can still see the outline of it!



# Math Activity:

## Clean up the Earth

### What you need for this activity:

- Clean up the earth game
- Paper clip
- Pencil
- Pom poms (or anything small and similar)

### Directions:

This game will let your child work on their number skills-both recognition and quantifying!

Depending on how many children are playing place pom poms on the earth this is the “trash.” You want at least 10 pieces per child (So, if you have 3 people playing 30 pom poms).

Place the pencil (sharp side down) in the middle of the spinner with the paperclip underneath and have your child flick the clip (to act as a spinner). Whatever number they land on is the number of pieces of “trash” they pick up.

Whichever child has the most pieces of trash at the end wins! You can also talk about “greater than and less than” while playing. AKA child one has 20 pieces and child two has 15. Child, one has a greater number of pieces.

# Language Activity:

## What I can do!

### What you need for this activity:

- \*Group of kids
- \*Camera (optional)
- \*Construction paper (optional)

### Directions:

For this activity, your child will work on using the word “I.”

Following reading the book (or your choice of an earth friendly book) ask your child(ren) what they would like to do to help the earth. To practice using “I” they can say “To help the earth I will...because I....” (Or something similar).

For the optional portion-take pictures of them doing that activity (for example if they say pick up trash take a photo of them doing that). Then have them dictate to you what they are doing in the photo and write it down on the construction paper.

If you have a large group of children, you can create a “save the earth” book and staple all of their pictures together!

# Science Activity:

## Making paper

### What you need for this activity:

- \*A bunch of shredded up paper
- \*Water
- \*Bowl
- \*Wire Hanger
- \*Old stocking
- \*Blender

### Directions:

- \*For this activity children will make paper!
- \*First-take paper that is already shredded (or if you don't have any ask your child(ren) to shred up a bunch of (preferably) scrap paper.
- \*Next-place the shredded paper into a bowl and pour water over top. Until it is just covered. Let it soak overnight for best results.
- \*Once the paper is done soaking, squeeze the excess water out of it and place the paper into a blender. Blend it into a nice mush!
- \*Bend the wire hanger into a rectangular shape and tape it to close. Pull the stocking over top. (Only use ones you no longer want)!

\*Place your “frame” onto a cookie sheet.

\*Smash your paper mush onto your frame (removing even more water). Let it dry overnight and then reuse it!
