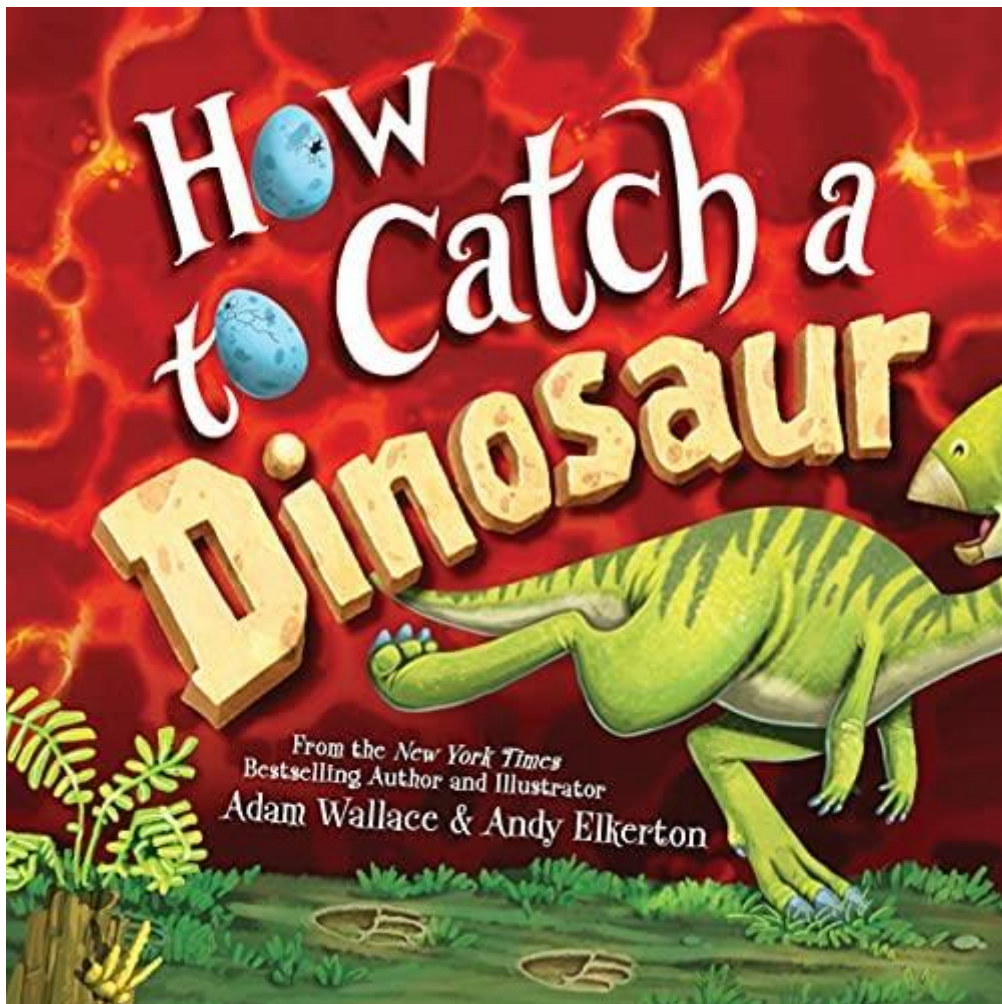

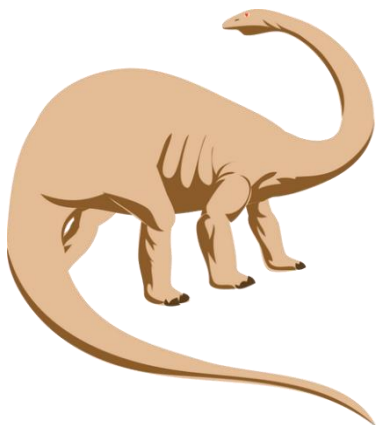
These are optional vocabulary cards to show your child before reading the story to help with understanding. It is also a great idea to point out the words while reading the book!

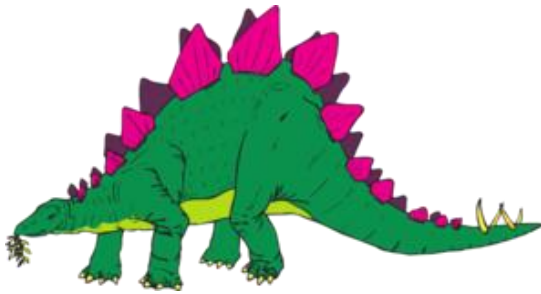

Art Project:

Dinosaur Fossils

What you need for this activity:

- * 1 cup Flour
- * 1/2 cup Salt
- *1/2 cup Water
- *Mixing bowl
- *Rolling Pin
- *Aluminum foil-lined cookie sheet
- *Dinosaur figurines (small)

Directions:

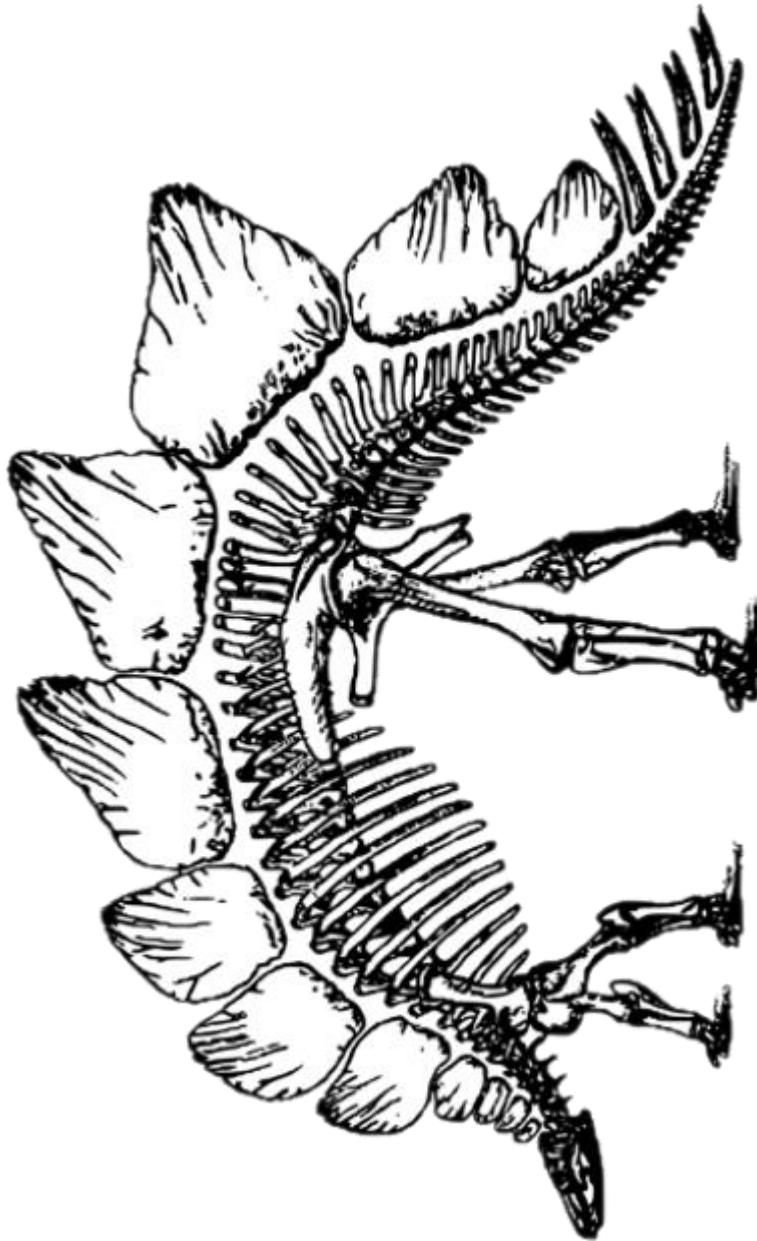
- *For this activity your child(ren) will create dinosaur “fossils.”
- *To start, make your salt dough! To do this, first combine the salt and flour in the mixing bowl (a great opportunity for your kids to participate and learn about measurement too)!
- *Slowly add in the water
- *Take turns kneading it until it has reached a good consistency (if it is too sticky, try adding in a bit of flour at a time).
- *Next, roll the dough into 1 inch ball and then flatten onto the cookie sheet.
- * Press the dinosaur figurines into the dough
- *Bake in the oven at about 300 for 25 minutes and/or just let it sit (until it hardens).
- **Note if you have a sensory bin, these are a great addition for a dinosaur themed bin. Place the fossils in the bin along with sand and paintbrushes. Let your child(ren) experiment with being a paleontologist!

- **Another option for this project is to create an actual dinosaur skeleton (more challenging option).

Print off an image (such as the one below) of a dinosaur skeleton. Place it under some plastic wrap.

Then have your child place the salt dough over the bones (forming it to look like a skeleton)!

Let the dough sit to dry!



Fine Motor Activity:

Dinosaur Dot Stampers

What you need for this activity:

*Dot Stampers

*Dinosaur Dot Page

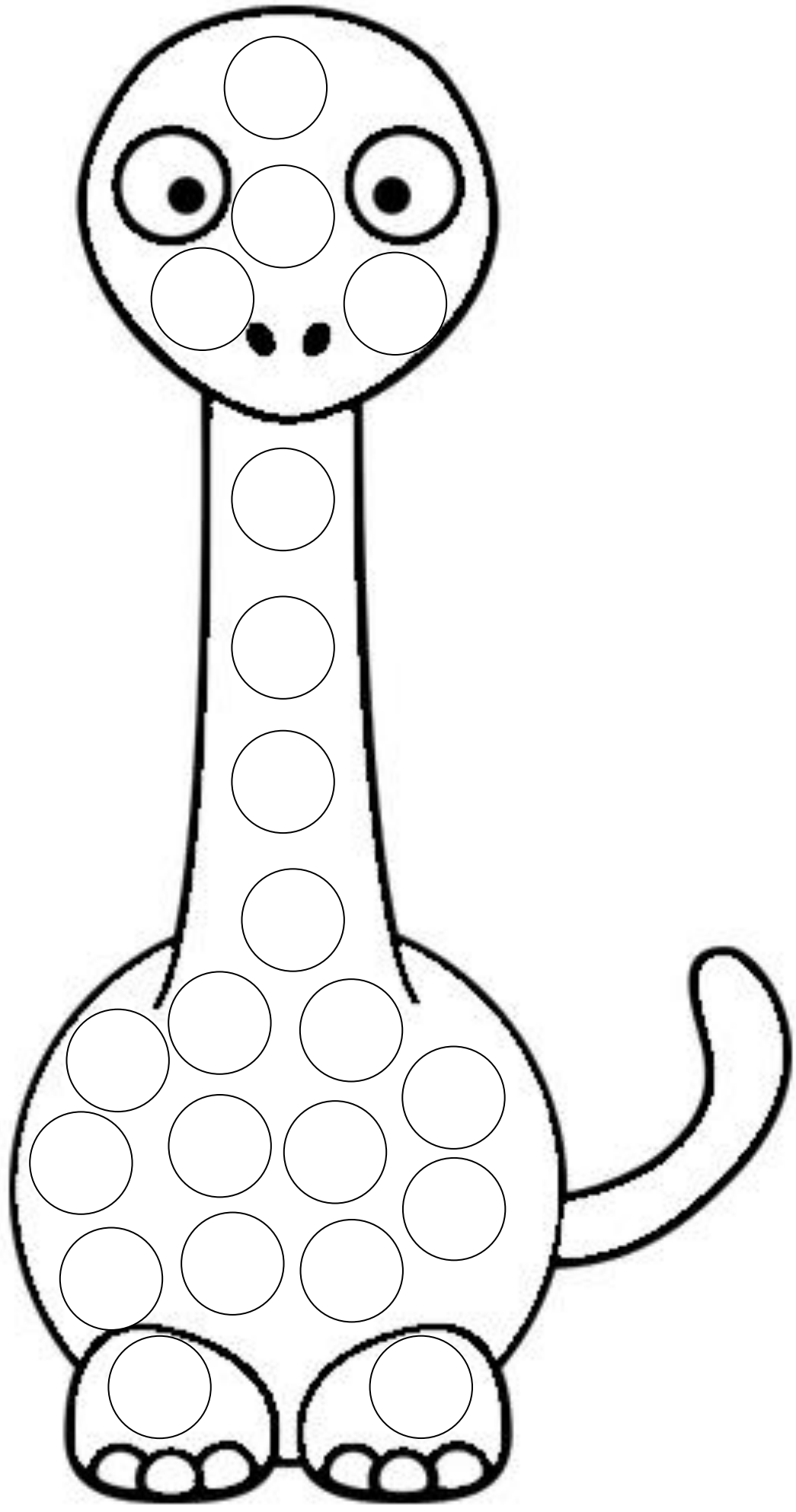
Directions:

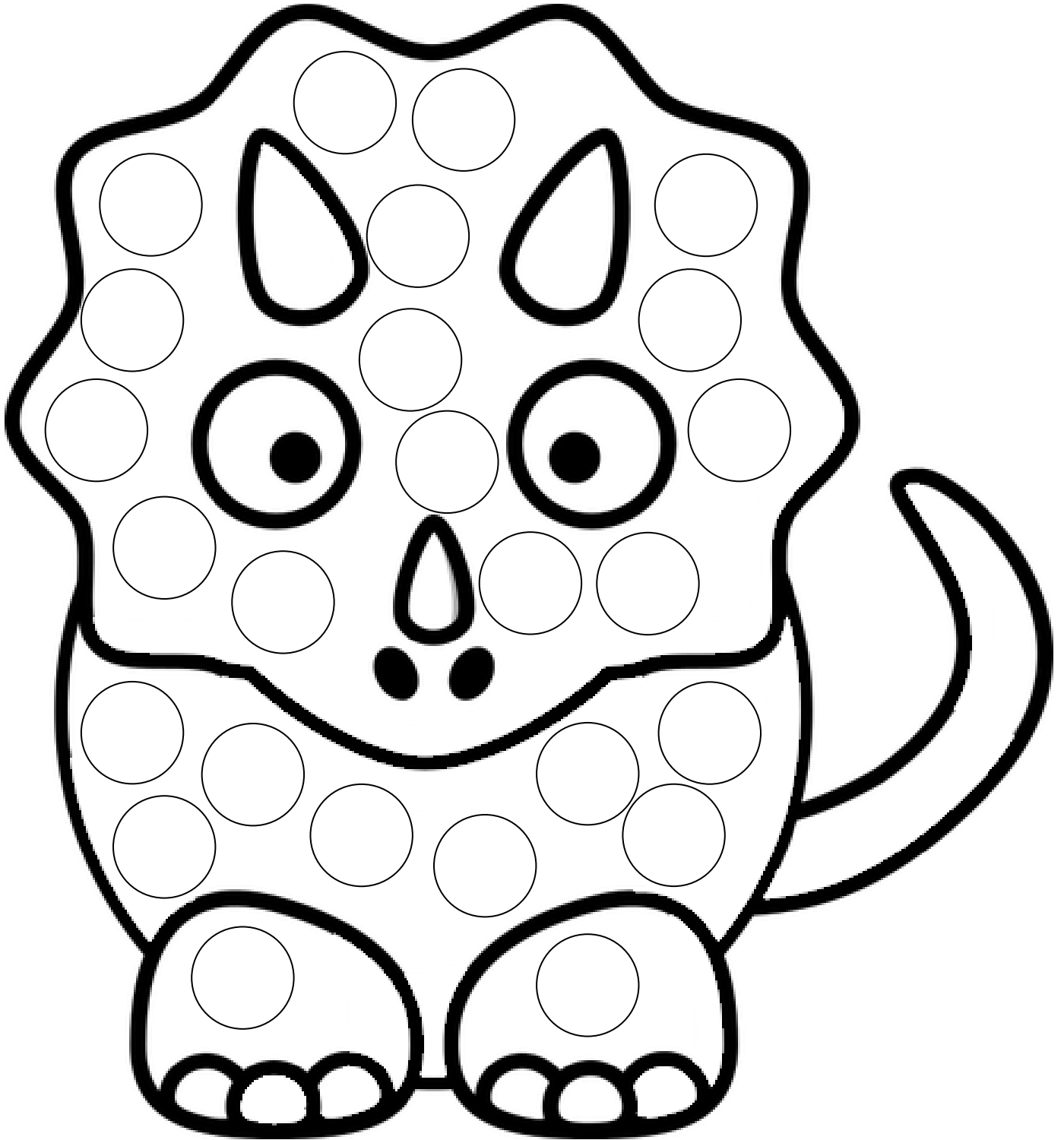
* This activity will allow your child to practice their hand-eye coordination as they place the stampers directly inside the dots. It will also help them to practice how much pressure to use while using the stamper, a vital skill needed to properly write later on.

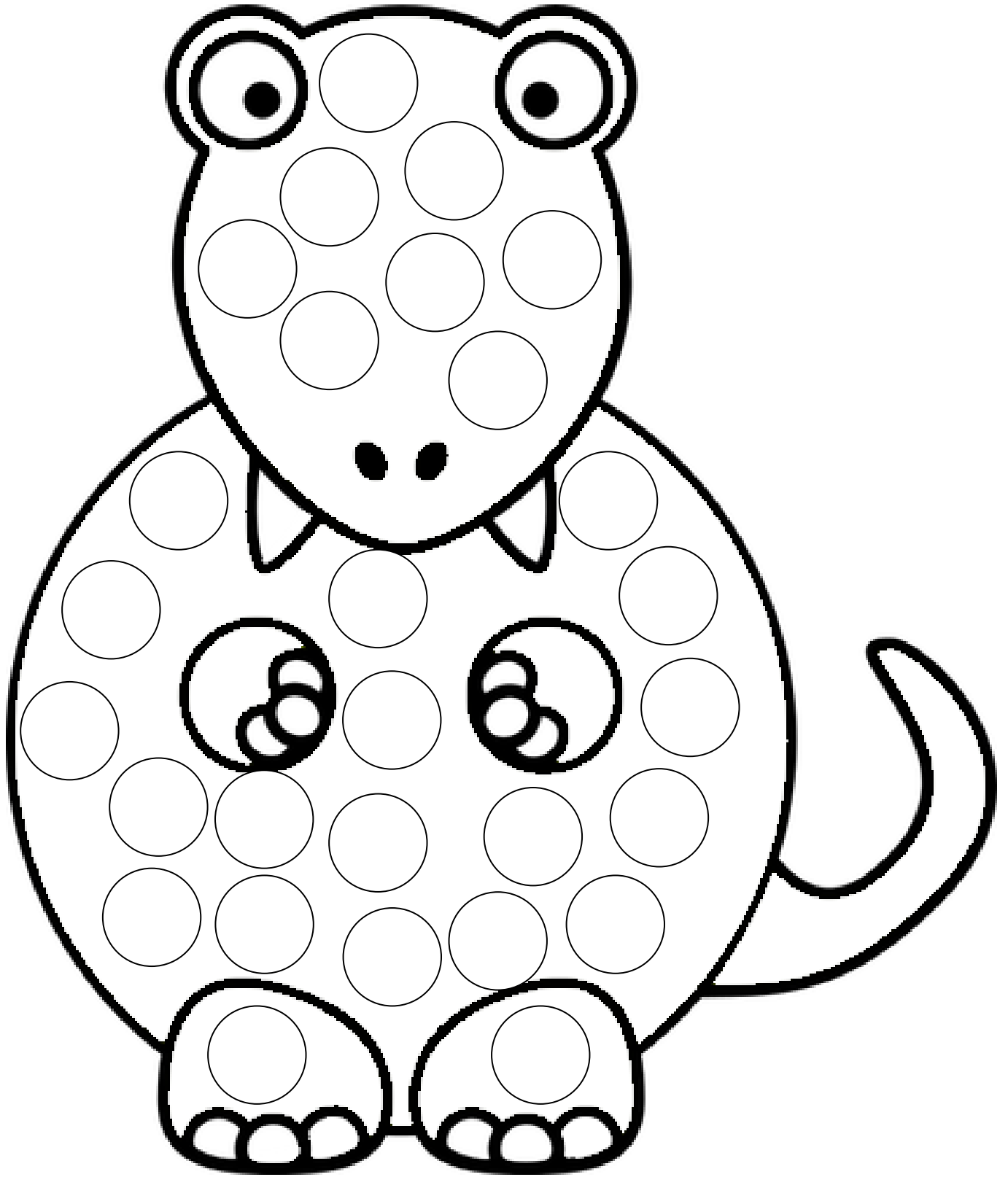
*Have your child(ren) choose one (or more) dinosaur dot stamper pages.

*Ask them to place the stamper directly inside of each circle.

*If desired, when they are finished with the dots, they can practice coloring inside of each dinosaur as well!







Math Activity:

Dinosaur Shapes

What you need for this activity:

*Dinosaur Shapes Page

*Child-safe Scissors

*Non-toxic glue stick

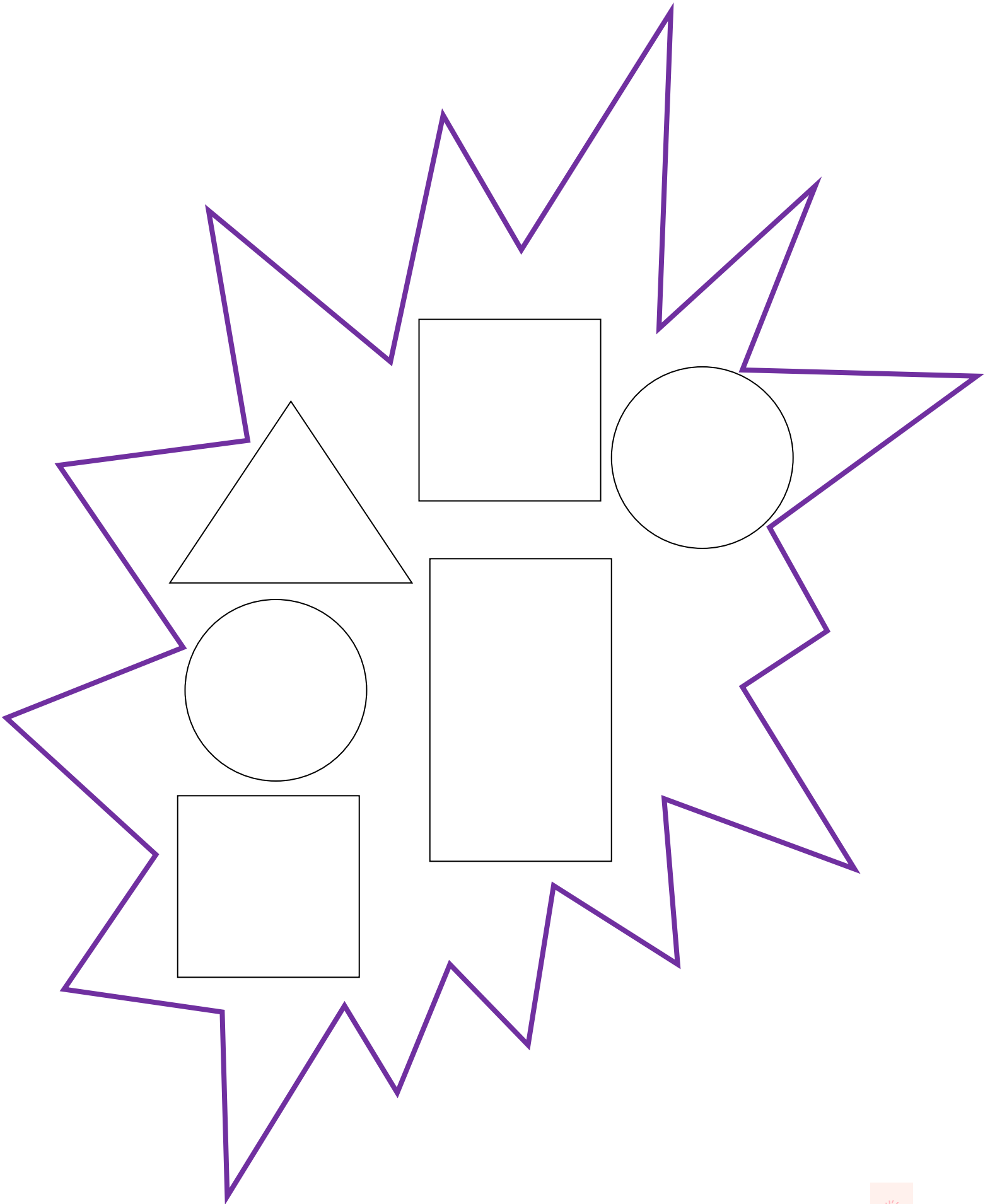
Directions:

This activity will help develop your child(ren's) understanding of shapes.

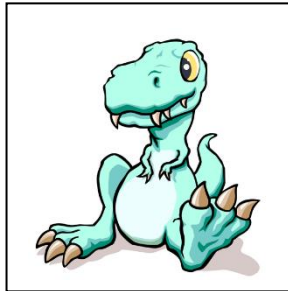
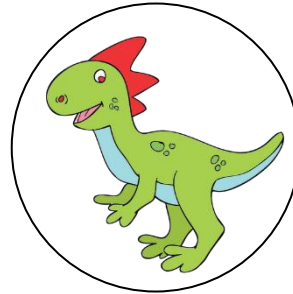
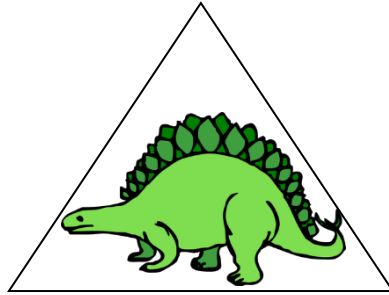
*Cut out each of the dinosaur shapes pieces (if your child is able to do so, have them do it)!

*Ask them to sort the dinosaurs into their correct shapes (i.e., the dinosaur that is inside of the triangle outline goes into a triangle space.

**We also highly recommend a shape-sorting toy to further practice this skill in a fun way!



Dinosaur Shapes



Language Activity:

Please kind dinosaurs

What you need for this activity:

- *Group of children
- *Choice of known objects

Directions:

- *This activity combines oral language (including manners words) with movement!
- *You need two or more people in order to play this game.
- *Either choose specific (child-safe) objects and have them close by OR if you are already in a room with a bunch of toys and such, they can be chosen at random.
- *One person acts as the “requester” and the other(s) are the dinosaurs.
- *The requester begins by saying “PLEASE kind dinosaurs bring me...(object).” The “dinosaurs” then say “Yes we can, how should we move?” The requester responds with “OH PLEASE (movement: jump, skip, run, walk, stomp, etc.)” The children then move in that way to grab the item.
- *Whoever returns to the requester first gives them the item. The requester says “thank you kind dinosaur” and the “dinosaur” says “you are welcome.” This person then becomes the “requester” and the “requester” becomes a “dinosaur.”
- *To add more of a dinosaur twist to it they could also say “run like a velociraptor,” “stomp like a T-Rex” and so forth.

Science Activity:

Break the Ice

What you need for this activity:

- *Cupcake Pan
- *Plastic Dinosaurs
- *Water
- *Freezer
- *Cookie Sheet(s)
- *Towel

Directions:

*For this science activity your child(ren) will experiment with different ways of how to get the dinosaurs OUT of ice.

*To start, place your dinosaurs into the cupcake pan (we suggest one in each opening).

**To make it easier to get the ice out afterwards, you may want to place a cupcake liner in first.

*Place the pan in the freezer until all of the dinosaurs are frozen solid

*Then: let your child(ren) experiment with how to get the dinosaurs out of the ice! See what methods they come up with and encourage them to test various ways. (We suggest placing on a cookie sheet on a towel so that less water goes everywhere).

*Some leading suggestions if needed:

-ice melts when warm

-ice can break (i.e., if you have a plastic hammer or a good spot to drop the ice – without it breaking anything else) **If they want to hit the ice, we do suggest glasses so nothing gets into eyes).
